

Dear Church Family,



We are very fortunate to have high caliber volunteers working together with the board to manage the facility and finances. Lucy Grenke once again invested countless hours this past year serving as our treasurer, forecaster, and accountant. Other key volunteers include Barry Thompson (Secretary), Shauna Lutzer (Associate Treasurer), Reinhard Harder (Finance & Audit Committee), Ursula Lutzer, and the tellers. Many additional volunteers worked tirelessly behind-the-scenes taking care of our building and property maintenance. Special appreciation is also warranted for the Projects and Partnerships committee who ensure our Missions funds are effectively allocated. A special thanks to all of you for your valued contributions!



During last year's budget process we felt challenged to propose a faith budget, and through your faithful tithes and offerings, God blessed us with a 19% operating revenue increase over the prior year. Coupling this together with restrained spending and prudent fiscal management by the staff and ministry team, we were able to achieve a net surplus. The proposed 2015/16 budget represents a 6% increase over the prior year's operating income and we are confident that God will continue to provide and bless Grace Point Church. Due to the continued growth in staff and budget, we are proposing one additional part-time position in the upcoming budget to address some of the current and upcoming administrative and accounting challenges.

Please continue to support the Pastors and Board of Elders with prayer as they provide continued direction. The Board of Trustees also asks for your prayers for God's wisdom and direction in the coming year.

GERMAN SENIORS MINISTRY

Since October 1995, Grace Point Church of God (then Edmonton German Church of God) is offering services in English as well as in German on Sunday mornings. Although English services were offered as early as 1990, it was in 1995 that the leadership of the church saw it necessary to start regular English services on Sunday morning in order to serve the growing English speaking community.



Since then several pastors have served regularly in the German services: Pastor Fritz Lenk, Pastor Oscar Berzins, Pastor George Lutzer, and Pastor Egon Wilhelm. We are thankful for their faithful ministry of teaching and caring.

Who would have imagined 20 years ago where we are now today? The then German Church has become a ministry to German seniors while the then small English speaking community has grown to more than 10 times of its original size. God has obviously blessed the courage and foresight of those pastors and leaders. Grace Point Church today stands on the shoulders of these leaders and these faithful German seniors. We are tremendously thankful for their courage, their prayers and their support over these past two decades.

With this rich heritage in mind we look back on another year of ministry to these faithful German seniors. I am thankful for Hilda Gutzmann who has kept the ministry organized and who has decorated the chapel. Thank you to Daniel Lutzer, Helmut Fode, Helmut Popke, and Pastor Dan Schultz for leading worship on Sunday mornings. Thank you to Karin Depner, Angie Bogner, Betty Schultz, Hilda Gutzmann and James King for playing the piano. And thank you for the many who have contributed special music or poems during the service.

DISCIPLESHIP AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH

Am I living a life worth imitating?

Discipleship is not just about gathering or providing information as to how to live as a follower of Jesus Christ. A vital part of discipleship is imitation. What does it look like to follow Jesus in our day to day grind? What rhythms of life allow us to bring fruit for God's Kingdom? The early disciples of Jesus had the privilege of living with Jesus 24/7. They saw every day what it means to live the kind of life God wants us to live. Jesus taught it to them, but more importantly he modelled it to them. In our approach to making more and better disciples ,we have by and large skipped the imitation part. We are good at providing information. We offer Bible studies and sermons and small groups. And we are also good at challenging people to live their daily lives with Jesus by offering prayer support. But we have not given much attention to imitation. Jesus said: Come and follow me. In other words: Come, watch me and learn from me. And after three years of living with Jesus, He entrusted them to the leadership of the Holy Spirit and let them innovate, meaning, to go to the ends of the earth and share the Good News with all nations.

Jesus taught us that discipleship is highly relational. If we want to make disciples, we don't just need to offer Bible studies on Bible reading and prayer and holy living. We need to enter into those personal relationships where we invite people into our lives: Come, walk with me and watch me for a while. Therefore we ask: Am I living a life worth imitating?


As we embark on this journey of becoming a discipling church, we are not trusting a roll out new programs ,but we are challenging leaders and pastors to live a life worth imitating. And then we are learning to invite others into discipling relationships where we give people access to our lives, to journey with us for a while until we release them into making disciples of Jesus. This is challenging! This takes time! But it's worth it! Eleven men having spent time with Jesus and released under the guidance and power of the Holy Spirit, changed the course of history. If Jesus thought this was smart, we do well to think and do the same.

Here are the books we studied in depth:

Jonah: Navigating a Life Interrupted by Pricilla Shirer. In this study of Jonah we discovered that what you see as an interruption may truly be God's divine invitation to a life so much bigger that you can imagine. We explored that Jonah (and we) had no idea the impact he was making by just being obedient to where God was sending him, that in our obedience to God, He will use us.

The Shelter of God's Promises by Sheila Walsh. In this study we took a closer look at God's promises to us written in His Word. The promise of provision, peace, that we can be confident in His plan, His love for us, His grace, hope, strength and that we know there is something better for us in store once we get to heaven.

<u>The Patriarchs</u> by Beth Moore. In this study we looked in depth into Genesis 12-50. We were able to know, very personally, the characters: Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, their

families, and the encounters God had with them. We learned how God pursued a relationship with them (and us), and His plan to bless all people. We learned how God pursued them (and us) when they were at their best, weakest and worst. What a joy it was to learn that God can use us all to glorify Him, if we let Him.

<u>Wonderstruck</u> by Margaret Feinberg. This book encouraged us to slow down, open our eyes and become aware again of the wonder of God in our daily lives. It encouraged to take the time to rest and balance our lives and to engage in meaningful prayer. It reminded us to that we were meant for community and that forgiveness is for our health and benefit. And we learned to have a heart of thanks, so we can be a shining light for God where we live out our lives.

It has been such a joy to see women grow in their personal relationship with Christ. To see women desire to get to know Christ more and to actively be a shining light for Him where He has placed them in the lives of their families, at work, where they live. Friendships have blossomed as the women have journeyed alongside one an-



PRAYER





We will retool with a new name, a higher level of visitation type ministry and a simpler form of accountability and administration. Great things are ahead for our Stephen Ministers. There have been several people coming to the church for emotional, spiritual and financial support. Each situation brings new challenges and needs. Our benevolent fund was overspent this year with the various needs for support. Please pray for our staff and support ministry to have wisdom to help individuals and families effectively.

The Just Us (Single Parent Family) ministry led by Jen Newell-Power has grown significantly. There are about 11 families including 24 children benefiting from the connection and community facilitated by the Just Us Ministry. We are celebrating with Jen and her team of volunteers as they have experienced great turnouts and significant connections at events. This fall will include a Single and Parenting support group for Just Us participants.

The Men's group had a great year under the leadership of Randy Roesler, Kristian Olsen and David Birkholtz. The men continued to challenge each other to live out their faith in family and work.

In September, I went through Hungry For Life training to more effectively lead teams into the mission field. In February, we went on yet another trip to relocate a playground for the orphanage and support Shane Trusz as the new field director of HCAS.

In 2015 we have been going through some changes in terms of adding different parts to the ministry as well as changing different things within the ministry! First, I want to give a huge shout out to Matthew Bitzer who has signed on as the youth intern at Grace Point while he works on his education at Rocky Mountain Bible College. We have offered him the opportunity to serve in the ministry in a higher functioning role to gain some life experience while studying to hopefully one day be a youth pastor himself. Matt has filled a lot of roles this year in terms of planning, speaking, and administration, and does a lot of behind the scenes work to help make this ship run. And, although many don't see it, he has done a fantastic job.

Another shout out needs to go to Randy Schultz and the youth worship team, which started up this year. They led their first worship time during a couple Deeper events this year! Randy and team have invested a lot of time and effort into this part of the youth ministry and it was very cool to see some fruit coming out of the ministry! I look forward to how this ministry investment affects future worship teams on a Grace Point level where youth are getting plugged regularly!

Another change that we decided to run with was transitioning from serving at different organizations to impacting our community around us! One of those was going around and picking up garbage and recyclables and helping keep our community clean. Another example was our missions team garage sale which was a huge success and based on some of the stories coming from people, we helped a lot of people new to the community with setting up their house and furnishing it for a more than reasonable price! Funny enough, we even had two men who liked the garage sale so much they came to church that Sunday! Also at Christmas we set up care packages for Hope Mission as well as for Youth Emergency Shelter filled with supplies given to us by the organizations and also encouragements/scripture. It was awesome seeing the youth stepping up and getting these packages ready and also putting some very heavy and heart felt messages in these packages.

On a tougher note, I also want to thank the Grace Point Church family for your patience and support for myself and my family throughout this year. We knew going into this year that it was going to be tough when my mom was diagnosed with terminal cancer last July, but we didn't have timelines and everything was very touch and go. Your prayers and thoughts and kind gestures like meals and gifts and encouragement notes kept us strong through this last year, and although we didn't get a chance to thank everyone every time, please know that your support was critical for us. Although mom passed away in February, I haven't had very much time to step away from the ministry so I look forward to coming back from Haiti and spending some time alone on a bike trip west to process everything and catch my breath.

As we continue to grow as a youth ministry, our goal is to continue to promote that relationships with God and others are the most important thing we value in Core Youth. We are at our highest numbers yet as we average between 35-50 youth on a regular basis and this is very exciting news, but also poses challenges to keeping an intimate environment and investing in everyone equally! If you are thinking about getting involved in a ministry, we are always looking for leaders. We could use some people who want to invest in the youth. They are, after all, a huge part of Grace Point!

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

It is such a privilege to serve at a church bustling and bursting with little people so full of enthusiasm! It is a true blessing to have our greatest struggle be with limited space and seating. God continues to make Himself known through the children's ministries here – shaping the lives of leaders and children alike! I believe two of the reasons God continues to expand our territory is that we have a vision for children's ministry and we that believe that the time invested in children can, and will, have an eternal impact!

I was touched this year by the story of Tony Campolo's search to answer the question "What kills a church? What makes a once-thriving church wither away and die?" When he saw his childhood church boarded up, he sought to find answers by digging through the old records. He began his search through the history of the year he became a Christian and was met with notes that read "That it had not been a particularly good year for the church," the author admitted. "Giving was down from the previous year. Mission activity was subdued. Attendance had declined. There were only three conversions over the course of the year, and they were "just children." Dr. Campolo stared at the page in disbelief and irritation. "Wait a minute!" he said out loud. "I was one of those three! And I know the other two. One spent his life in mission service in Africa, while the other became president of a seminary here in the United States. And I've given my life to Christian higher education. What do you mean, just three children came to Christ that year?" The sociologist had found the answer to his research question. A church begins to die when it says, "They were just children." If that is the mind-set, decline and decay will surely follow (taken from Dr. Wess Stafford's book, Too Small to Ignore).

As I meet with my children's ministry teams, I am continually reminded that we may not always see the fruit of what we do in our lifetime, but we will definitely see it in heaven. What seemed like a bad year at Tony Campolo's childhood church, was truly the seed of a larger ministry that would have a ripple effect throughout eternity. Charles Spurgeon states "You may speak but a word to a child, and in that child there may be slumbering a noble heart which shall stir the Christian Church in years to come."

This year we welcomed Lindsey Arnason to our children's ministry staff team. Her responsibilities include the GraceKidz administration, Plan to Protect ® implementation, and much, much more. Jen Power continues to be a blessing as she manages the AWANA administration, nursery team coordination, and GraceKidz prep, to name only a few of the many things she does each week. I am thankful to have such a skilled and loving team who truly have a vision for children's ministry!

Thank you Grace Point Church family for valuing children's ministry and for recognizing that investments we make here will be seen in heaven!

GraceKidz is our Sunday morning children's ministry and the team consists of approximately twenty small group leaders, twenty assistants, eight registration desk leaders, eight guest registration desk leaders, and a large group team. As you can see, it takes a small army to make each week happen but armies have a purpose and so does our team. Our goal is to show God's love to the kids each week, teach them truth in a way that reminds them that real faith will shape the way they live and think, and draw them into a deeper relationship with God. We strive to help them develop relationships with the other children, engage in an exciting worship time, and to have them store God's Word in their heart.

As we look to the fall, I would encourage you to pray for wisdom as we plan for the expanding number of children joining us each week. This year alone, we added 65 new children to our Sunday morning fami-

lies registered. We currently have 226 children registered and our guest registration team is busy each week welcoming newcomers.



Two combined influences making a greater IMPACT!



AWANA is our mid-week children's ministry that runs from September to the beginning of April. Our team of leaders and the 186 clubbers registered enjoyed numerous special events including: Crazy Hair Night, the AWANA Grand Prix, Pie In the Face Night, and a celebratory Closing Program. The primary goal of AWANA is to reach kids with the Gospel and then to train and equip them with a deeper understanding of Scripture. Clubbers (children registered in AWANA) are motivated as they receive badges, awards, and AWANA money for working through individual handbooks. I continue to be amazed at the way God draws families in our community to AWANA. Once again, we had a large percentage of kids who do not come from church homes attending. One of my favorite stories was of a Grace Point family who brought two boys along with their kids each week. The boys would come over after school and do some work in the handbooks together before they came. One of our clubbers had the privilege of leading his friend to Christ before AWANA. God is big and uses many means to reach the lost – we must never forget that children can be leaders too!

This year we made the difficult decision to close our AWANA club to children from other churches. For

the past few years, we have reached fire capacity early and have had to turn away clubbers who do not have a home church. Beginning this fall, we will be accepting only Grace Point families and families who do not have a church home. It is our hope that as many as possible will be reached with the Gospel through this ministry and know we can be certain that many of our clubbers from other churches have a way in

which to hear the Good News while some on our wait list did not.

Looking to fall, we are excited to be expanding the number of spaces for community families and would ask that you pray that God would prepare hearts and bring families that would be open to Him.





KIDS CAMPS



The summer will be full of fun for our Grace Point children and community as we engage children and leaders in our three summer camps: Art Camp (July 7 - 11), Soccer Camp (August 10 - 14), and Children's Camp at Deer Valley Meadows (August 3 - 7).

We are thrilled to have two summer interns joining us, Rachel Clark and Matt Bitzer. They will be working in the GraceKidz children's ministry on Sundays and focusing on the details for our summer camps. The demand for our on-site camps has grown tremendously and we have reached capacity long before the early bird deadline. We are encouraged by the number of children from our community who are involved as we know that God is opening the door for us to speak His love into their lives. Last year during art camp, a child looked up during the Bible teaching time and said, "I'm from a different religion and I don't believe in your God, but I do wonder if Jesus loves children from other religions." What a beautiful opportunity to share God's love!

I would ask that you remember the children and leaders who will be attending these camps in your prayers. May God use our camps as opportunities for us to tell children that Jesus loves them and for whole families be drawn to Him!

This year our numbers in nursery have stabilized as a bubble of children have begun to move up to GraceKidz Preschool. The structure of our nursery volunteers has been expanded with the welcome addition of team leads to the nursery each week. Janice Weiss, Joline Lemke, Karla Hayduk, Kari Robbins and our newest lead Shanna McKinnon bring a ray of sunshine each week as they welcome families and keep things flowing. We have 20 volunteers serving in teams of 5 each week, including some dedicated youth! The nursery is truly a safe and loving environment where the littlest Grace Point kids learn that church is a great place to be!

WORSHIP MINISTRY

He says, "Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth." Ps. 46:10 (NIV)

Whether we are still, or we are shouting and clapping, one truth remains...God is God and He will be exalted! He will never be defeated! How awesome it is that

in Canada, we have the freedom to sing together, joining our voices in public expres-

sion of worship to the King. The earth will exalt Him and we are privileged just to join in with the rocks and trees, in praise to Him.

I have been on staff here at Grace Point Church, as Worship Director, since October 2014 and have enjoyed getting to know the volunteers that offer their time and talent each week, in order to run the music portion of our Sunday service. It is a large group of people that come together to make it happen! I came in with the desire just to familiarize myself with the Grace Point system...not to rock the boat or demand any changes. There were so many things that impressed me in those first three months of connecting!



Then, I asked the Holy Spirit to help me see where there could be improvements and changes that would benefit the volunteers who are in the Worship Department, as well as the church at large. In cooperation with the other worship team leaders (Randy Schultz, LeAnne Cazemier, Barry Ukrainetz, Tabea Berg) and the preaching pastors (George Lutzer, Egbert Lubek, David Van Roon), I made a decision to ask the preaching pastors to have their general sermon outline to the worship leaders 10 days in advance of the actual Sunday they would preach it. This, then, allows for the worship leaders to have their songs chosen and sent out to their teams six days prior to the Sunday. The upside of this is that the teams can practice at home and come to rehearsal more prepared. It also will open doors for more impactful moments in the service, where testimonies, special numbers and particular congregational songs can complement the sermon theme.

We have just purchased a new (digital) soundboard, which is exciting! I hope that it will eliminate some of the ghostly crackling we experienced with the previous one. Also, we have purchased a new keyboard, with a better selection of sounds, to replace the outdated one we had been using (or use, in conjunction with the old one, actually). We have also subscribed to Planning Center Online, a tool for our worship team volunteers to use, both at home during the week to rehearse, as well as on Sunday mornings during the service. It has become our service outline tool, as well, and has built in tracking abilities, to remember the songs we've done, people who've served, etc. This was not available to me, when I started...it was difficult to know what songs Grace Point Church even considered their "base" of songs! I'm still on the learning curve, where that is concerned, but it's coming.

We have had several interested volunteers approach me, wanting to be involved. In some ways, this is a wonderful thing and in some ways, it is very difficult. The part that is difficult is simply finding room for the areas that are already quite full (eg. Vocalists...we have an abundance of them!) I anticipate, however, that as we continue to grow, we will need more volunteers and that welcoming them in now, even slowly at the beginning, is a wise choice. In our Discovery Class One, we ask the people, "What is your gift? How can you use it at Grace Point?" So, if someone has the gift of tech/music/singing, I will do whatever I can to involve them and help them create community in their area of serving.

Speaking of community, that is one of my main goals this year...to build worship volunteer camaraderie and community. I have arranged a couple of gatherings and will continue to do so, in an attempt to make this feel like a place "where everybody knows your name" for my worship peeps.

Our tech guru, Vince Hayduk, continues to bless us with his service to our audio and visual needs. I am deeply thankful for his expertise and servanthood. Hopefully, I will glean just a fraction of his knowledge while working with him. I am thankful for the worship leaders, too, who give of themselves, over and over, without compensation. Their dedication is so valuable to me.






