1. What might Jesus be showing me about myself that I would rather not see?



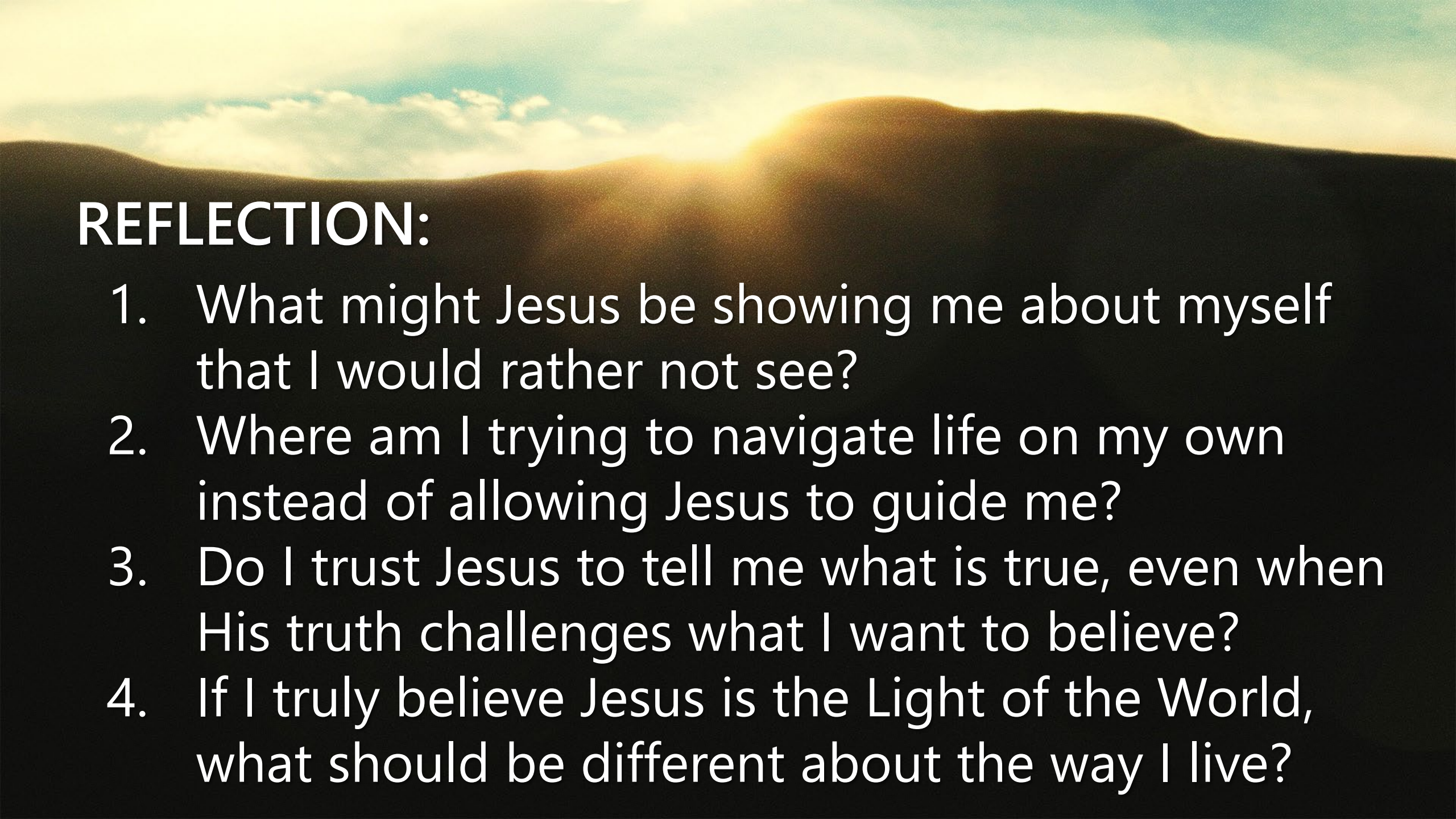
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3. Do I trust Jesus to tell me what is true, even when His truth challenges what I want to believe?
